# READING Log

## Instruction:

1. Find a short passage (**approximately 750 and 900 words**) written in *standard English*. The length can be just around the same length as the passage/s in your textbook.
2. You may select **any topics**, for instance, environment; science and technology; history; cultural business and economics; or any current issues.
3. Your selected stories could be from any sources—books, magazines, newspapers, or websites, but please make sure you **properly cite** the source and the author's name.
4. The main objective of this project is to encourage your reading—for main ideas, for relevant supports, for understanding logical argument and for recognising writers' purpose and attitude (tone) as presented in the selected story of yours. For this part, as a starter, feel free to use the reading template provided for you.
5. Every time you read something, you need to complete **TWO tasks**: (1) complete the details of what you've read in the 'reading log' (the table); and (2) complete the reading template, or you may write the reading note/s on your own (but make sure you have everything you need on the note).
6. **The final date for submitting your reading logs is the last day of our class, BUT** you may submit your reading logs any time IN OUR CLASS, during the semester, once you've completed ONE table (6 stories).

(ALTOGETHER, COUNT AS ONE SUBMISSION)

You need **FIVE submissions** to get the full score for this project.
